

Old St. Paul's Cemetery: Representative Listing of Burials

from *Old St. Paul's Cemetery: A Shelter for Eternity* by Ruth Mascari

Sadly, there is no accurate listing of the names of persons buried in Old St. Paul's Cemetery. It is estimated that more than a thousand may be interred here. The persons and families selected for the following catalogue are representative of the Baltimore region of the 1800s. The abbreviation AIP precedes names of those also in the plot.

♦ **Armistead, George, Lt. Col.** ♦ 1780-1818, hero of the Battle of Baltimore (commanded Fort McHenry); married sister of Christopher Hughes (see Hughes)

♦ **Armistead, Lewis Addison, Major General CSA** ♦ 1817-1863; wounded July 5 at Gettysburg. "Tell General Hancock (handing the general's aid his watch) that I know I did my country a great wrong when I took up arms against her, for which I am sorry, but for which I cannot live to atone." Interred four weeks at Spangler Farm; disinterred by Dr. Chamberlain of Philadelphia; embalmed and placed in a rough box; interred at Hollywood Cemetery, Richmond; eventually sent to Baltimore. (See Hughes)

♦ **McKim, Isaac** ♦ 1775-1838; plot 415; five-term member of Congress, made fortune in shipping; Society to Protect Free Negroes; aid to Gen. Sam Smith, Battle of Baltimore; board of directors B&O Railroad; died in D.C.; John Quincy Adams and Daniel Webster attended his funeral, processing to cemetery
